



## PCAB BOARD RESOLUTION № 178 Series of 2017

## SETTING AMENDMENTS TO THE EXPIRATION OF REGISTRATION FOR GOVERNMENT PROJECTS AND IMPOSITION OF ADDITIONAL PROCESSING FEE FOR FILING OF RE-REGISTRATION BEYOND THE EXPIRATION DATE

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Board Resolution № 091, s. 2012, ordering the Synchronization of the Expiration of Registration for Government Projects with that of Contractor's License on June 30:
- WHEREAS, it has been more than five (5) years that PCAB has been implementing the synchronization scheme;
- Whereas, after an intensive review of the simultaneous filing of applications for registration for government projects and license renewal from 2012 to 2017, especially during the months of May, June, July of every year, the peak period for license renewal, there was also a significant increase in the filing of applications for registration for gov't. projects;
- WHEREAS, the existing schedule of having a common expiration date for license and registration and synchronizing the same which resulted in an increase in volume of filed applications for registration and license renewal which needs to be processed on time, effectively and efficiently.
- Now, Therefore, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the Board **RESOLVES** as it is hereby **RESOLVED** to revert back Item 4.4. of the Revised Guidelines for Registration and Classification of Contractors which provides that the duly registered for government projects shall be issued a regular Certificate of Registration valid for a period of three (3) years from the date of issuance. The **Board FURTHER RESOLVED** that PCAB shall impose a penalty of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000) as Additional Processing Fee (APF) for filing beyond the expiration date.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
