Mandate

Created by virtue of Presidential Decree Number 1167, the Philippine Construction Overseas (POCB) is an implementing board of the Construction Industry Authority of the Philippines, a government agency attached to the Department of Trade and Industry. The POCB has the sole mandate of implementing the state policy of promoting the interests of the Philippine construction industry in overseas markets by actively encouraging and supporting activities that lead to increased and sustained of management, exports engineering, other technical, and highly-skilled manpower services for overseas construction projects, and Philippine-made materials construction To safeguard the equipment. interests of both client and supplier, we control regulate and participation of Filipino construction contractors and consultants in overseas construction projects and administer the grant of available incentives

No construction contractor shall tender or bid for any overseas project unless registered and authorized by POCB.

Minimum Requirements:

- ✓ Appropriate Philippine Contractors Accreditation Board (PCAB) License:
 - AA General Construction Contractors;
 - A for Specialty Contractors
- Five (5) years of continuous actual operations
- Successfully completed single project of not less than Ten Million Pesos (PHP10M) for General Contractors or Five Million Pesos (PHP5M) for Specialty Contractors, within the last five (5) years.
- ✓ Approval of the POCB Board
